COUNTYWIDE ELECTED OFFICIALS AND JUSTICE OF THE PEACE DECLARATION

Rules of the Republican Party of Arkansas (Art 3, Sec 2 A) provide that Countywide Elected Officials and Justices of the Peace may serve as members of the District Committee if they declare that they wish to serve in that capacity. Remaining District Committee members will be elected during the RPBC meeting on March 14, 2024.*

As a member of the District Committee, you will be expected to attend two meetings per year at a location within the Third Congressional District. If you cannot attend a scheduled meeting, you are expected to assign your proxy to a registered voter from Benton County who will attend the meeting.

*** BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

Arkansas has four Congressional Districts, each with its own District Committee. Benton County is in the Third District.

Republican Congressional District Committees consist of members from each county within the Congressional District. Benton County is allotted 58 members who can vote on the decisions made at these meetings.

The primary purpose of the District Committee is to elect a Republican US Congressman and to assist County Committees within the District.

The District Committee meets twice yearly in March and October. Attending these meetings provides a deeper understanding of how the Republican Party works. It's a great opportunity to learn as well as meet other active Republicans from the Third District.
